Mr Deakin and Mr Greenwood are members of the New Forest Commoners' Defence Association committee. Mr Deakin is also Treasurer.

Mr Deakin and Mr Readhead are Directors of the New Forest Livestock Society. He is also members of the New Forest Stallion Syndicate.

Mr Dowsett is a Forestry Commission Volunteer Ranger.

Mr Greenwood is employed part-time by Cadland Estate and therefore has an interest in the Stallion Grazing. Mr Greenwood also has a stallion of his own.

Mr Hallam Mills declared an interest in HLS Schemes as his Estate is in Higher Level Stewardship. The Estate is also involved in the Better Boundaries Project, run by the New Forest Land Advice Service with support from Natural England. Mr Mills is also a Patron of the New Forest Trust

Mrs Westerhoff is a tenant of the Forestry Commission. Mrs Westerhoff has been formally appointed to the Board of Trustees of the New Forest Trust.

2017/9652 CONDITION OF STOCK

RESUME

The Head Agister said as the year draws to a close stock is in exceptionally good condition. It has been a good year for grass growth and there has been plenty of food on the Forest. The cattle are also looking very well. Many have now been removed from the Forest for the winter and the Agisters are busy assisting with TB testing and marking cattle for 2018.

The December Welfare Tour was well attended by welfare organisations with many new faces along with the regular attendees. It was a cold but bright day and the tour saw a good number of animals but many were out of sight sheltering from the cold wind. The attendees were very impressed with the condition of the animals; many said they are looking the best they have ever seen them.

The Donkey Sanctuary carried out its usual "pre welfare tour" tour of the Forest and they were very impressed with the condition of the donkeys they saw.

Mr Mills said the welfare tour was a 10/10 success. Mr Dowsett passed on thanks from his colleagues at the Forestry Commission for their invitation to the tour. He said many had no understanding of the work of the Agisters and Verderers and all had found the tour beneficial. The Official Verderer thanked the Head Agister, Mr Deakin and Mr Brian Ingram for organising the welfare tour.

Mr Deakin said the extra pony sale held by the New Forest Livestock Society on Thursday 7th December had been beneficial to the Forest. The Head Agister agreed, saying it had given the Agisters and Commoners the opportunity to catch up mares with foals that had been missed on the drifts. Mr Readhead said the Society is planning to hold a December sale in 2018.

Mr Mills asked the Head Agister if there are any current TB concerns in the Forest. The Head Agister said that testing will be ongoing until the end of January and that there have been one or two issues. Mr Greenwood mentioned that there are currently several herds around the perimeter of the Forest which are under investigation for possible reactors.

Mr Greenwood asked the Head Agister if there are any signs of ponies stripping bark in the Forest. Mrs Westerhoff said she had walked through Mark Ash and could not see any evidence of freshly barked trees. Mr Deakin said the Forestry Commission has initiated a monitoring programme. More information will be requested from the Deputy Surveyor.

2017/9655 THE ANIMAL ACCIDENT REPORT FOR NOVEMBER 2017

The Agisters attended 24 accidents in November. This compares with 23 in November last year.

- 4 ponies, 1 donkey and 1 pig were killed. 3 ponies were injured and humanely destroyed. 4 ponies were injured.
- 3 accidents occurred in the daylight, 3 at twilight and 18 in the dark.
- 2 accidents in November were not reported (Hit & Run).
- 12 motorists are known to have been local.

The number of animals killed and injured to date is 69, compared with 79 in the same period last year.

2017/9656 BT OPENREACH RE-SUBMISSION IN RESPECT OF BROADBAND DISCHARGE CABINET BROCKENHURST 2 RHINEFIELD ROAD

This re-submission has been necessary following a survey which resulted in the original site for Brockenhurst 2 being deemed unsuitable.

To support the request for permission to stand Brockenhurst 2 on grazing land (Rhinefield Road), it is proposed that dragons teeth be installed at a site close to Brockenhurst 1 which is regularly encroached on by vehicle traffic. That area will be returned to grass. The proposal was suggested by the Forestry Commission.

The proposal is considered acceptable and consent is granted. However, BT Open reach must understand that land accepted in mitigation for another proposal cannot be used again in any other submission to the Court. This will be communicated to BT.
