#### ANNOUNCEMENTS & DECISIONS BY THE OFFICIAL VERDERER

2017/9345 HIT AND RUN INCIDENTS

At the May Court we received Presentment from Richard Deacon about a hit and run incident in the Linwood area.

In order to encourage people to report drivers responsible for hit and run RTAs involving Forest stock, we are increasing, the maximum reward for information leading to the conviction of a hit and run driver to up to £5000. This is effective immediately and is being offered with the support of the New Forest Pony Breeding and Cattle Society, the New Forest Commoners' Defence Association and World Horse Welfare for which support the Verderers are very grateful. This enhanced reward will be available in connection with any incident occurring on or after 1st January 2017.

This is a good moment to remind everyone who drives on the unfenced roads within the New Forest that the animals have right of way. Some of the more important measures that have been taken in recent years to reduce animal accidents include:-

Regular cutting back of roadside vegetation by the Forestry Commission to improve sight lines;

The Verderers, through the Verderers Grazing Scheme, making reflective collars available free of charge to all commoners for their ponies and donkeys. We are currently experimenting with collars for cattle;

Hampshire County Council deploying changing signs at various locations to warn drivers of the risks of animal accidents;

The Verderers making a substantial annual financial contribution to the regular deployment of the Speed Camera Van which is operated by Hampshire Police.

I would also like to take this opportunity to remind all drivers of the provisions of the Highway Code relating to speed limits and I quote:-

"The speed limit is the absolute maximum and does not mean it is safe to drive at that speed irrespective of conditions. Driving at speeds too fast for the road and traffic conditions is dangerous. You should always reduce your speed when

- the road layout or condition presents hazards, such as bends
- sharing the road with pedestrians, cyclists and horse riders, particularly children and motorcyclists
- weather conditions make it safer to do so
- driving at night as it is more difficult to see other road users."

We believe that if drivers slow down as they approach animals grazing on the verge and move over a little as they pass, a significant reduction in the number of accidents would result.

The Shared Forest Project has produced a poster asking drivers to slow down at night, saying that 40mph is too fast in the dark.

## 2017/9346 INVITATION TO THE POLICE AND CRIME COMMISSIONER

I have written to Mr Michael Lane, inviting him to meet with us to discuss the many measures that we and others take to try to reduce animal accidents in the Forest and, in particular, to discuss what further might be done, particularly in relation to 'hit and run' incidents.

## 2017/9347 THE NATIONAL PARK RECREATION MANAGEMENT STRATEGY 2010 - 2030

The National Park is reviewing this strategy and as part of that review, on Friday 16th June it launched a public consultation exercise on recreation management for the future. There is an online questionnaire which will also be available in paper form from the NPA. This is an important exercise and I would urge people to complete the questionnaire but when doing so think of what is good for the Forest when considering their answers to the questions, and not what is perhaps just good for their own particular personal use of the Forest.

#### 2017/9348 LYNDHURST BYPASS

At the April Court we received presentments from Roger Gilley and Alexi Sugden, then prospective Liberal Democrat candidate for Lyndhurst and Fordingbridge, on the topic of 'talks' about talks' about a bypass for Lyndhurst.

Any proposal for such a bypass would come from the Highway Authority, Hampshire County Council, and there is no such proposal at present.

Mr Pasmore added he has been asking repeatedly over the past year for this straightforward work to correct the levels to be undertaken but nothing has happened despite repeated assurances that it was in hand.

Mrs Westerhoff, however, disagreed with Mr Pasmore. She said that indeed some trees are dead and that is the effect of redirecting the water course back into its original meanders. Mrs Westerhoff felt it will not be a recurring problem and she felt the system needs to be left to settle down.

The bridges at Pondhead are falling apart. The Forestry Commission is aware. A suggestion that one of the bridges should be taken away is felt to be counterproductive as it would make things worse.
