4. Outcomes of the	Following the VGS Consultative Group meetings, several new projects and	
VGS Consultative	initiatives have been adopted for inclusion into the VGS.	
Group and VGS	These include the paying of an additional supplementary payment to Forest	
Report	cattle herds that fulfilled their grazing commitment in 2022 as an incentive to	
	retain their cattle during difficult times. This was based on £200,000 divided	
	between 73 unique holding numbers and resulted in a supplementary	
	payment of £2,739.72 – this was paid into the nominated VGS account of	
	the person listed on BCMS for each holding number. Provided that there is	
	a continuing need for additional support for those depasturing cattle the HLS	
	Board is willing to make similar financial support available annually during	
	the life of the existing HLS.	
	The VGS Consultative Group agreed that forest commoners should receive	
	additional support to enable them to keep pigs for mast. The VGS terms	
	and conditions have now changed to increase the 1st 20 x pigs put out for	
	pannage to 0.6LU – additional pigs to receive 0.3LU.	
	The VGS Consultative Group agreed to a Fallen Stock Programme to claim	
	£100 towards collection costs for non-RTA deaths of animals entered on	
	their VGS forms.

9. VGS Rule	2 x VGS rule breaches were discussed – both were for failing to get poor	
Breaches	cattle off the forest when requested by the Agister and requiring warning	
	letters to be sent threatening byelaw prosecution would follow if the animals	
	were not removed. In both cases the animals were eventually removed but	
	delay in remedying the issue has been classed as an infringement of the	
	VGS terms and Conditions 1.5; 1.10; 6.2; 6.3 and 6.4;
